PROGRAMS

History, Middle School, High School

Established in 1971, Open Meadow Alternative Schools is one of Portland's oldest alternative education providers. Students come to Open Meadow when other educational settings have proven unsuccessful; 84% of new students admitted had dropped out of school prior to attending Open Meadow.

The heart of Open Meadow's programs lies in developing a positive self-concept, and respectful relationships with others. By emphasizing personal responsibility, accountability and decision-making skills, as well as a healthy lifestyle and respect for others, students experience success and develop a sense of purpose and

connection to their education and their future.

Open Meadow's curriculum is designed to engage students with a variety of learning styles and skill levels. Classes average 12 students, allowing for frequent teacher/student interaction. Open Meadow works to cultivate self-directed learners who are responsible for themselves and the environment. Open Meadow students work to meet local and state benchmarks, and toward grade promotion and a high school diploma.

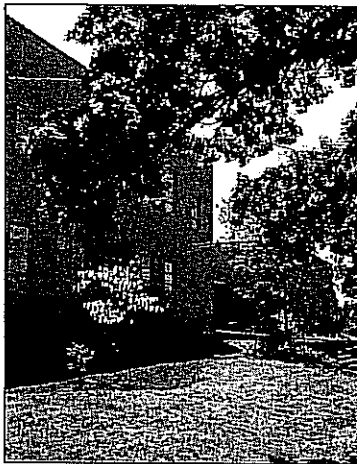

Serving sixth to eighth grade students, Open Meadow Middle School opened its doors in 1998 in response to a direct community need - 25% of students who drop out of school do so by the ninth grade. Students work to build academic skills and toward promotion from the eighth grade. Curriculum is aligned with eighth grade benchmarks identified by the Oregon Department of Education.



Open Meadow Middle School has a 14,000 sq. ft. facility with five large classrooms, a gymnasium, and a cafeteria.

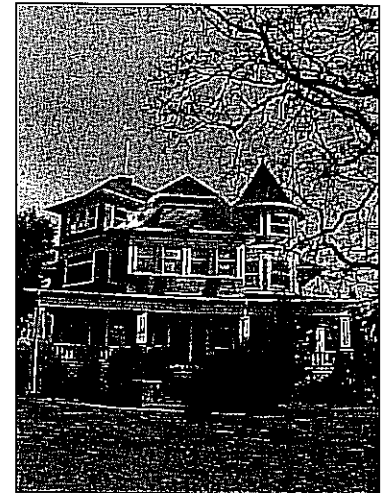

CRUE

Open Meadow CRUE (Corps Restoring the Urban Environment) program serves older high school youth ages 16-21. Students who attend the CRUE program choose to participate in one of three crews: Technology, Natural Resources, and Social Service. Each crew works on community service and work-based learning projects throughout the school year.

YO!

Open Meadow YO! (Youth Opportunity) is one of nine local organizations working in partnership to provide education, employment, and youth development services to youth ages 14-24 who reside in Portland's North and Northeast Enterprise Community.

CORPORATE CONNECTIONS

Open Meadow Corporate Connections is the newest addition to Open Meadow's programs. Its purpose is to place young people in full-time career track jobs with local companies. In partnership with several corporations, Open Meadow will serve underemployed high school graduates and Open Meadow High School students within four months of graduation. Partners are Open Meadow, The Standard, Thomason Autogroup, Comcast, Bullivant Houser Bailey, Preston Gates Ellis, the Portland Trail Blazers, City of Portland, and Portland State University. Partners are developing a training curriculum that leads to internships and growth-oriented job placement at these Portland area corporations.

Open Meadow STEP UP was developed in 2003-04 by Open Meadow in partnership with Roosevelt High School to serve students most in need of academic assistance. STEP UP is a leadership and academic support program designed to help students transition from middle school to high school. The program provides students with year-round, personalized academic support, advocacy and tutoring. In the 2004-05 school year, STEP UP will operate on site at Roosevelt High School as well as expand to serve Roosevelt feeder middle schools, Portsmouth, George and Open Meadow Middle School.

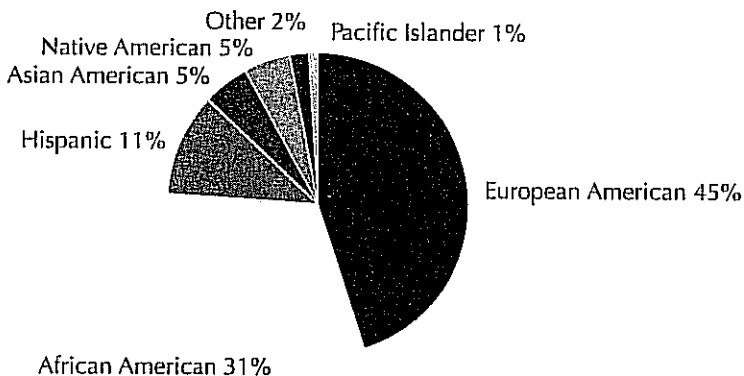

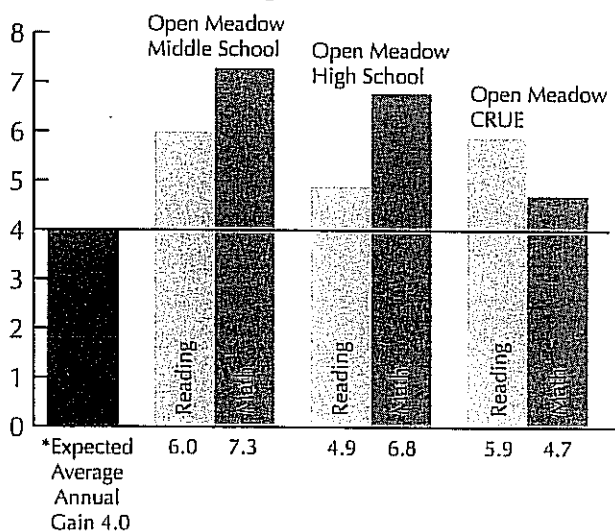
STUDENT ETHNICITY

Partnership with The Standard Flourishes

A dynamic partnership between Open Meadow and The Standard

Great things often begin very simply. A relationship that began several years ago over a bin of potatoes at the Oregon Food Bank has grown into a full-fledged, dynamic partnership between Open Meadow and The Standard. Carole Smith, Open Meadow's Executive Director, met Mike Winslow, vice president, general counsel and corporate secretary with The Standard, while both were volunteering bagging spuds. Conversation led to a visit to the school and one thing led to another.

Now The Standard partners with Open Meadow in many ways including providing internships and employment opportunities for students, assistance developing Open Meadow's website, updating Open Meadow's technology infrastructure, and consultation in strategic planning.

Gregg Harrod, assistant vice president of Strategic Initiatives, serves as Open Meadow's current Board Chair. Mike Winslow is a member of Open Meadow's Sustainability Campaign Committee. Thirty-four employees of The Standard volunteered countless hours of professional services during the 2003-04 school year.

Corporate Connections, Open Meadow's newest program, came about as a result of the growing partnership with The Standard. Corporate Connections, with eight corporate partners including The Standard, will develop a corporate training program for high risk youth. It is designed to serve 20 youth in its first year. Commitments from partners will result in full-time, growth-oriented employment for young people.

Open Meadow Receives Toyota Tapestry Award

An innovative science project garnered Open Meadow a Toyota Tapestry award for the second time in three years. "Birds on the Edge" partners Open Meadow students with local restoration professionals to perform bird surveys over the Willamette Bluffs' 230-acre riparian urban natural area. This area contains critical habitat for neo-tropical migratory birds. Many species are declining in number.

Students are assessing the impact of wildfires and prescribed burns that have occurred over the past three years and the subsequent restoration on the bird populations. They are also creating a website depicting their analysis. The website will link to a national U.S. Fish & Wildlife initiative to protect migratory birds through Portland Parks and Recreation's Urban Migratory Bird Program website.

Open Meadow CRUE Students Award Grants

In June of 2004, Open Meadow CRUE students distributed \$4,000 from the Northwest Health Foundation and \$2,000 from the PGE Foundation to three non-profits that serve mentally ill youth. "This is an innovative way to leverage money that would go out to non-profits anyway. Kids choose what they think is important and learn in the process," remarked Carol Reed of the PGE Foundation.

Students chose a focus for funding, developed a mission statement, researched which local non-profits addressed their focus, and released a request for proposals. The students conducted site visits at applicant agencies and ultimately chose to fund Janus Youth - Clackamas House, OHSU Children's Psychiatric Day Treatment Center and Clackamas Women's Services.



Students Exhibit Art at First Thursday

Student artwork was the focus of a community event in the Wieden + Kennedy lobby on May 6, 2004. Part of the Pearl District's First Thursday Art Walk, the art show was a celebration of the students' work from the 2003-04 school year. Hors d'oeuvres were served and students hosted and discussed their art with the many people who attended.

Announcing a New Home for Open Meadow's Transition Programs

Portland area construction industry leaders teamed with Open Meadow to renovate an historic North Portland building for Open Meadow Transition Programs.

What's old is new again for Open Meadow Transition Programs, thanks to generous donors and to a group of Portland area construction experts. Builders, architects and engineers worked hard to meet the July 2004 deadline for completion of a building renovation effort. On July 9, Open Meadow received the occupancy permit for the new facility.

Contractor Lease Crutcher Lewis, architects SRG Partnership and the consulting engineers at KPFF joined together in 2001 to help design the building renovations. Purchase and remodeling costs totaled \$1.3 million.

In April 2000, Open Meadow refinanced two school properties through Shore Bank to purchase the property located on Wabash Avenue. The Klahn Company building (a former factory producing bank night deposit bags) is now home for Open Meadow CRUE (Corps Restoring the

Urban Environment) Program as well as several new transition programs who share this wonderful new facility with CRUE: STEP UP, Open Meadow YO!, and Open Meadow's newest program,

Corporate Connections. The transition programs were previously sharing space at Open Meadow's high school building. This new facility allows both the high school and transition programs ample space to fully serve the student population.

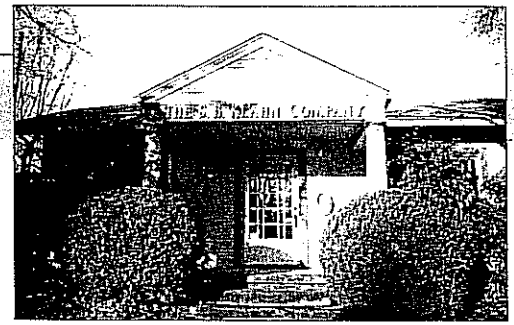
"The new building brings a breath of fresh air to our programs," says

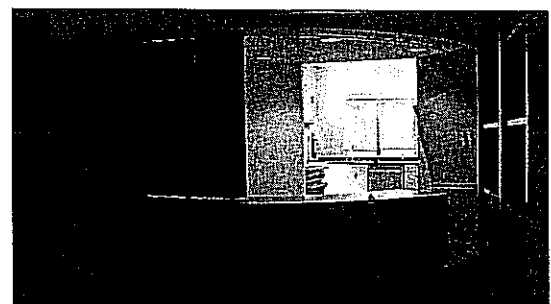

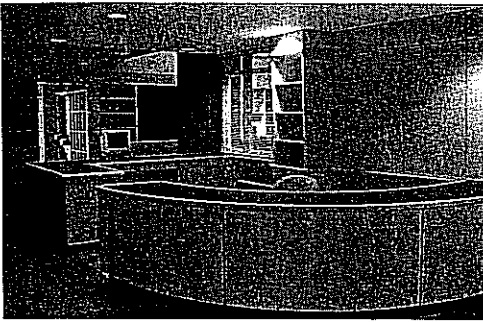

Open Meadow Introduces Advocate Sponsorship Program

Advocacy is at the heart of Open Meadow's success with youth at risk. Since 1971 Open Meadow has helped students turn their academic careers around: creating positive learning experiences, and gaining remarkable results. Giving students intimate and engaging educational environments, as well as a teacher who gets to know them and represents them – as their "Advocate" – is the "secret" to this success.



Advocacy Works

The needs throughout the educational system are great. Lawmakers and school board members struggle with decisions and strive for examples. Open Meadow has been recognized nationally as a model for what is right about education – and what works.

Locally, during the 2004-2005 school year, Open Meadow is partnering with middle schools in the Roosevelt High School Cluster to bring *advocate groups* to the public middle schools. We are proud of the success we have had within our own walls over the past 33 years, and excited by the challenge of bringing that educational experience to a broader community.

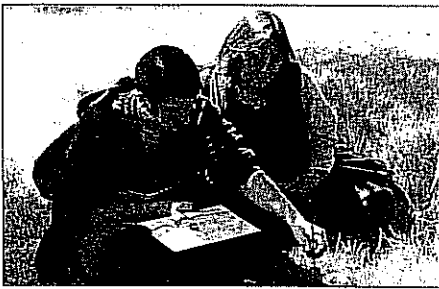
- ▶ The support provided through Advocate groups is the cornerstone of Open Meadow's success with students.
- ▶ Advocate groups consist of 12 students and a staff Teacher/Advocate.
- ▶ Students stay in the same advocate group during their time at Open Meadow. They change classes and teachers, but the Advocate relationship stays constant.
- ▶ Advocate activities include:
 - daily peer support group meetings and informal check-ins
 - service project participation
 - issue-focused groups
 - events to promote team building

In addition, Teacher/Advocates provide:

- ▶ Crisis intervention and referral
- ▶ Case management
- ▶ Communication with parents and other significant adults in the students' lives
- ▶ Academic planning and monitoring
- ▶ Transition planning

STEP UP Completes its first year



Open Meadow Creates Unique Partnership

In June of 2004, STEP UP completed its first full program year serving a total of 91 students. STEP UP is a unique leadership and academic support program developed by Open Meadow in partnership with Roosevelt High School. STEP UP includes two primary programs: STEP UP Leadership Academy and STEP UP Tutoring Academy.

STEP UP Leadership Academy helps students transition from eighth grade to the completion of their freshman year in high school. Students were identified by their middle school teachers and counselors as being particularly challenged by the changes facing them in high school, and potentially at-risk of dropping out of school.

Through STEP UP, students develop the habits, attitudes, resources, and behaviors that will help them achieve a high level of success both in and out of school. STEP UP Tutoring Academy provides students with personalized academic support starting the summer before

they enter the ninth grade and continuing throughout their freshman year.

STEP UP's first year was so successful (see outcomes below) that the program is expanding to the Roosevelt Cluster feeder Middle Schools in the 2004-05 school year.

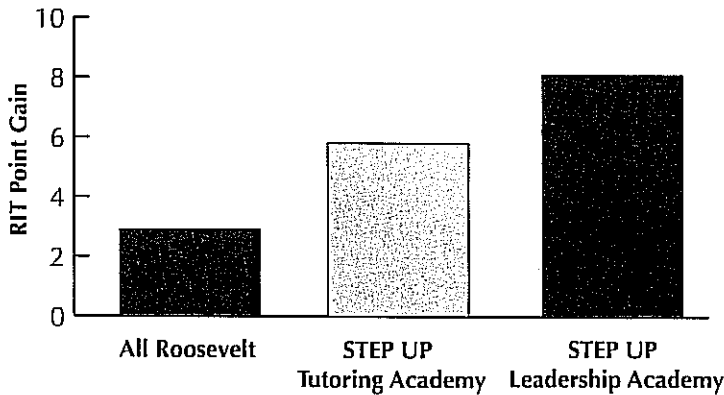
Key Elements of STEP UP:

- ▶ Summer week-long Leadership Camps (June – July)
- ▶ Summer Tutoring (July- August)
- ▶ Intensive after-school academic support (year round)
- ▶ Leadership development (year round)
- ▶ Parent/Guardian support
- ▶ Community involvement opportunities
- ▶ Peer mentorship (each freshman is paired with upper class peer mentor)

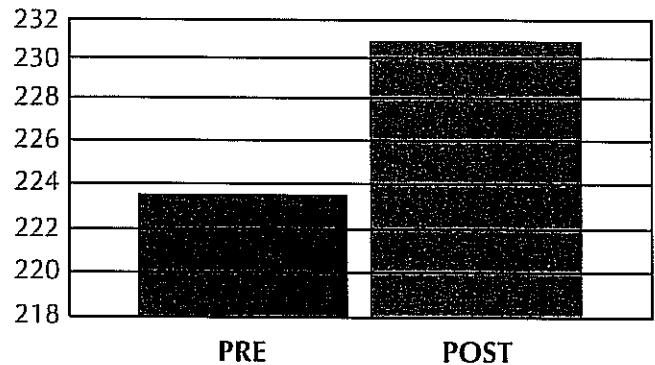
STEP UP Achieves Strong Outcomes

4 points = one grade level



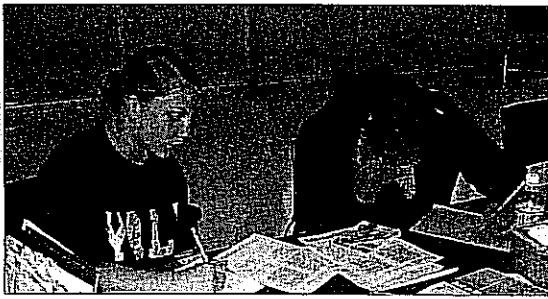
Math Skills Gains

STEP UP students tutored in math showed accelerated skill gain on the Oregon Statewide Mathematics Knowledge and Skills and the C.A.T. Math Survey 6+. Participants showed an average 7.5 point gain, or close to two grade levels. The group average was well below the 8th grade benchmark (231) at the start of the program, and was at benchmark at completion of the first year.
